What is the PE and Sports Premium Grant?

The PE and Sport Premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The aim is to develop an enjoyment of sport and physical activity, and to promote a healthy lifestyle in children from an early age. Schools receive Physical Education (PE) and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 3 to 6.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport you offer. This means that the Academy should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

The Sports priority for children at LFPA is the continued development of good attitudes towards health, sports and physical activity. The impact of the PE spending is:

- All children are involved in physical activity
- High attendance in extra-curricular clubs
- Increased involvement in competitive sports
- All children understand the physical and social benefits of participating in physical activity
