#### How To Use The Sentence Planners

**Objective:** These sentence planners help children with expressive language difficulties during spoken or written activities. They are colour coded, for example, verbs are yellow, nouns are orange. They provide a structure for spoken and written language for children. They are also useful for children with English as an additional language.



When to use: Use these sentence planners during spoken or written activities. You could provide laminated copies of the sentence planners around the class. Sentence planners for a variety of sentence types are provided. You may like to use the colour coded pictures to build your own sentence types.

**Colour coding:** Extend the colour coding around the classroom. For example, on display boards print or colour in words in their coded colour, so verbs are yellow, people & names are pink, nouns are orange, etc. Colour coding is an excellent strategy for children who struggle with both understanding language and using language.

#### Naming Game Board

**Objective:** This game focuses on categories of words. Being able to categorise words is an important skill when learning new vocabulary.

**How to play:** Use one naming board for each player. You will need counters and a die. Each player takes a turn to roll the die and move to the corresponding square on the board. Then the player names the number of things shown on the die from that category.

For example, if you roll a 5 and land on wild animals, you must name 5 wild animals,

and so on.











To make this game easier: Ask children to only name one item from the category on their turn. Or ask every member of the group to name one item in that category.


To make this game harder: Ask children to name items within subcategories every so often, for example when they land on 'fruit' ask pupils to name a soft fruit, a red fruit, a fruit with a stone, etc.
