Wow! Wow! Wow! I am so delighted with our LFPA staff and pupils on the outcome of this week's England Rocks TTRS competition:
1st out of 985 schools in London/Greater London! 6th out of 3576 primary schools taking part! 1st in The Park Academy Federation Trust!

A heartfelt thank you to the staff and especially our Maths Lead, Mr McElwee for leading so brilliantly on this! 348 Y2 to Y6 pupils took part—most ever. A huge thank you to the parents who supported their children in this whole school competition!

Let's look at how far we have come in this competition—London Rocks June 2020 LFPA finished in 17th position; England Rocks November 2021 we finished in 9th position; and in London Rocks June 2022 we were:

1st in The Park Academy Federation Trust! 1st in Hillingdon schools! 13th in all of London (over 400 schools)

About 300 children took part in KS1 & KS2; there were more girls than ever in the top 20!

Also I wanted to say how impressed I am with the highly supportive and aspirational parents who have been going into their child's classroom every Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning for the Stay & Read 10 minutes sessions. 



At Lake Farm Park we believe that English embodies the important skills of phonics, reading and writing together with speaking and listening. It lies at the heart of communication skills, leading ultimately to an empowerment of future acquisition of knowledge and the development of the whole child. English unites the important skills of reading, writing and speaking and listening, and therefore cannot be seen as separate entities. It is essential that, in order to communicate effectively, a child needs an environment rich in language to develop successfully.

Regularly reading to a child for the love of it provides a connection between parent and child from the very early days and helps build strong family ties. Lines from favourite stories enter the family lexicon. Families who enjoy reading together have more opportunities for discussion, developing empathy and attachment. Reading to their infant is one of the greatest gifts parents can give. By starting the journey of building a lifelong love of reading for pleasure, parents are giving their child the opportunity to be the best they can be: children who read for pleasure do better in a wide range of subjects at school and it also positively impacts children’s wellbeing.

Attendance Reminders

Lake Farm Park Academy has high expectations for every student from the moment they join our school. Children have the right to a high quality education and we provide this at Lake Farm Park Academy. High attendance is necessary to ensure that your child benefits fully from the learning opportunities on offer and to ensure they leave school having developed positive lifelong habits and as well rounded individuals.

Medical Appointments

Appointments, where possible, should be made outside of school hours or in the holiday period. This includes routine dental appointments. If this is unavoidable, your child should still attend school before or after the appointment where possible. Any session missed that was deemed reasonable to attend will be marked as unauthorised leave.

Absence Requests

Absence requests will only be considered for exceptional circumstances and these are dealt with on an individual basis.

What to do if your child cannot attend school:

Absence must be reported on a daily basis. You must contact the school (**before 9.00am**) on the first day of absence. This can be done by emailing

lfpaoffice@theparkfederation.org or by calling the school number 02085732622 option 1. Please leave the Child's name, class and the reason why they cannot attend school. If they are ill, please give a clear explanation of their condition. **For a prolonged absence due to illness, medical evidence will be requested.** This can be in the form of a prescription, medical paperwork or an appointment card/letter.

Pupils and Staff across the school participated in a range of different activities to explore different cultures throughout the week.
