Reception : In Reception children visited the Hobbledown Farm. They had a great time making slime, feeding the animals, exploring the farm and playing in the playground. We have also had a successful sports day and would like to say thank you to the parents who came to cheer on the children. We are now preparing for our musical extravaganza and hope to surprise everyone with what we have been practising for the event.

Year 1 : We have been learning about data. We have presented information using tally chart, pictograph and bar chart. Next week we will be revisiting division.

In English we are reading the story 'You Noisy Monkey'. We have memorised and acted out the story. Next week we will be writing our own version of the story.

Year 2 started our non-fiction text 'Storm Unicorn' and explored what a non-chronological report is ready to create their own. In maths we explored shape, recapping the properties of 3D shapes and comparing them. We enjoyed investigating symmetry in shape and patterns. In topic we are continuing to look at London's famous landmarks and from our trip created fact files about the London Eye. The children have drawn some fantastic observational drawing of the London landmarks developing their artistic skills in line and shape. A big thank you to the parents who supported us on the trip—the children had an amazing time!

Year 3

Year 3 have had another busy week and all the Year 3 teachers are very proud of how hard the children have worked not just this week but all year. This week we have been imaginative and created our own rainforest creature. We've been choosing the best adaptations and skills of different animals and creating our own. Everyone loved Miss Punia's Hedglug! We have also been learning about the features of an information text. We have all been very interested in reading about deforestation and the problems using palm oil creates in the rainforest.

Year 4 What a busy week or two, with Sports Day and practicing songs for Larky parky. We have taken our Pira and Puma tests and are very happy with the hard work they have put in over the year. The childhood promise trip to the beach was the icing on the cake after a long year of hard work!

Hedgehog : We have been practicing our writing, blending CVC words and looked at the sensory story of the slippery fish. The key stage 2 students in the SRP have been finishing their work on James and the giant peach by completing a project on New York,. We looked at Flat Stanley and thought about what country we could send him too.

Hay fever/Summer allergies : Now that we are in the summer term, and with the grass pollen season in full swing, we are writing to remind parents/carers that if your child suffers from hay fever or a related summer allergy, to prevent any unnecessary discomfort in school, could all parents please insure that their child be given any relevant medication at home before the school day commences.

If your child does need to take medication through the school day, could we please remind parents that the school is only able to administer PRESCRIPTION medicines. Any prescription medicine to be administered during the school day must be supplied to us in the original pharmacist's container and be accompanied by a 'Request for School to Administer Medicine' form which can be found on our website or can be collected from the school office.

Non-prescription medicines cannot be administered.

Remember to apply sunscreen whenever your kids will be in the sun. For best results, apply sunscreen about 15 to 30 minutes before kids go outside. Don't forget about ears, hands, feet, shoulders, and behind the neck

Please make sure you apply sun cream before your child comes to school in the morning.
