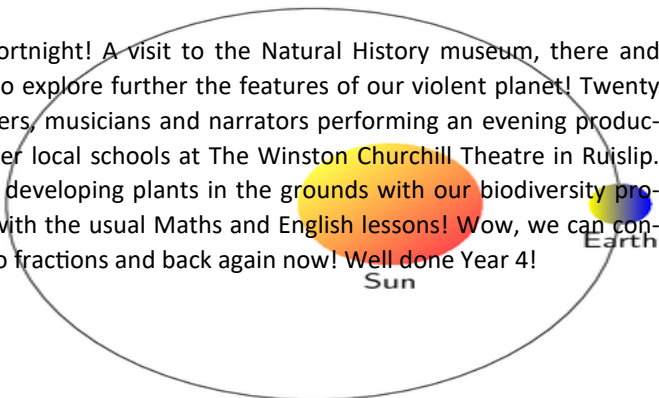
Reception :

The children have been working hard to investigate further and are writing newspaper reports to inform the rest of the country. In maths we have been learning about shape and data, looking closely at the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

Year 4

What a busy fortnight! A visit to the Natural History museum, there and back by train, to explore further the features of our violent planet! Twenty six young dancers, musicians and narrators performing an evening production with 3 other local schools at The Winston Churchill Theatre in Ruislip. Exploring early developing plants in the grounds with our biodiversity project, together with the usual Maths and English lessons! Wow, we can convert decimals to fractions and back again now! Year 1

In Year 1 we have been learning about fractions. We learn to find half and quarter of shapes and quantities. We have also been learning about recounts, writing about our trip to the Natural History Museum and what we did over the weekend. To do this we've had to learn how to use time connectives, write using past tense as well as writing in the first person.

Year 3

This week Year 3 have been working hard on understanding Fractions. We have learnt all about Newspaper reports and become journalists writing about Theseus and the Minotaur. Year 3 have also made Greek pots which was great fun, using clay and painting them. We have also made fossils in our Science lessons.

Hedgehog : Our children in SRP learnt about Chinese new year this week. They enjoyed learning about the different animals for each year and finding out which animals they were. We have also looked at some Greek myths, they enjoyed the story of Theseus and the Minotaur.



Parent Pay - Insufficient Funds

Please see below the Federation protocol for managing parent pay accounts without adequate payment for their child/ren's meals:

- Upon completing the register children choose their meal, at that point we are aware if children do not have adequate funds on their account.
 - The office team will then send a courtesy text to the parent/carer advising them of this and requesting payment to be made.
 - If the account is still not topped up, the attendance officer will then follow up with a courtesy phone call.
- If there is still no payment added, the child will receive a subsidiary meal (salad cart).

Please note, it is the parents'/carers' responsibility to ensure that there are adequate funds on their child's account. We recommend that accounts are topped up weekly/monthly to ensure that there are no shortfalls.



Get Active Breakfast and After School Club

After Easter holidays Breakfast and After School Clubs will be run by Get Active who are currently doing the same for one of the schools in the Trust.

All fees for both breakfast club and after school club must be paid in advance when booking places on the website. In an emergency place can be booked on the day of the club, however, after 12pm an admin fee of £2 may be charged.

To confirm the time slots and prices they will offer:

Breakfast Club 7.45am – 8.45am - £3.50 per child per day with Breakfast

After School 3.15pm – 6pm - £7.50 per child per day with a small snack and main meal

After School 3.15pm – 4.30pm - £4 per child per day with a small snack

After School 4.30pm – 6pm - £5 per child per day with a main meal

****These prices are an introductory price and will be reviewed at the end of the school year****
